# **Cleveland Play House Announces 2012-13 Season**

Two World Premieres Part of 97<sup>th</sup> Season at PlayhouseSquare

**CLEVELAND, OH** (*March 11, 2012*) - Artistic Director Michael Bloom announces the lineup for the 97<sup>th</sup> consecutive season of Cleveland Play House, its second at PlayhouseSquare in downtown Cleveland. Two world premieres and contemporary work contribute to the variety of entertainment Bloom has designed for the 2012-13 Season.

"Cleveland Play House has experienced an extraordinary transformation in our first season downtown," **reflects Bloom** on the institution's three new state-of-the-art venues. "And we've seen record-breaking single ticket sales." Building on that success, **Bloom remarks**, "With five contemporary plays, including two world premieres, next season affirms the company's commitment to its vision of being a top-tier contemporary theatre. Our exciting second season at PlayhouseSquare will bring even more variety, breadth and quality to our audiences and keep CPH in the national theatre conversation about new work."

The 2012-13 Season includes two world premieres. The first, *A Carol for Cleveland*, is a family-friendly fable for the holidays adapted by Eric Coble from a story by Cleveland's master mystery novelist, Les Roberts. The second world premiere is *Rich Girl* by Victoria Stewart that Bloom describes as "a clever and hip comedy about love and money in the age of CNBC," to be produced in the Second Stage. It is also the anchor production for the New Ground Theatre Festival in May of 2013. Northeast Ohio is known for being the cradle of professional football, so the city of Cleveland is the perfect place for a production of last year's Broadway hit *Lombardi*, which Bloom notes is "not just a sports play but a family drama about integrity, teamwork and second chances." Also in the new season, CPH rediscovers a lost classic in *Bell, Book and Candle*, "one of the wittiest romantic comedies written by an American playwright," remarks Bloom. *The Devil's Music: The Life and Blues of Bessie Smith* will turn the Allen Theatre into a jazz club when performer Miche Braden captures the soulful singing style and the feisty essence of the "Empress of the Blues." Two acclaimed dramas complete the season lineup. *The Whipping Man*, to be produced in the Second Stage, "is an utterly surprising and suspenseful period piece set just after the Civil War," says Bloom. "And the Tony Award nominee *Good People* is in my opinion the best play written so far in this century."

It's Christmas Eve, and all he has to his name is forty-eight bucks—and that isn't nearly enough to buy Christmas presents for his wife and his kids back home. Pushed to the brink, he commits a desperate act which changes his life in ways he never imagined. Hope, forgiveness, and humor fill this holiday tale of redemption.

# **Anchor production of New Ground Theatre Festival**

When 26-year-old Claudine meets Henry, a starving artist, she falls head over heels. Her mother, a financial guru, has her doubts. Is Henry everything her daughter has been looking for? Or is he after only one thing? A modern day adaptation of Henry James' *Washington Square*, this comedy by up-and-coming playwright Victoria Stewart is about how women relate to men, mothers and money - in that order. *Rich Girl* will be a world premiere and the anchor of New Ground Theatre Festival for 2013.

Founded in 1915, Cleveland Play House is America's first professional regional theatre. Throughout its rich history, Cleveland Play House has remained dedicated to its mission to inspire, stimulate and entertain diverse audiences in Northeast Ohio by producing plays and theatre education programs of the highest professional standards.
