Allen Theatre



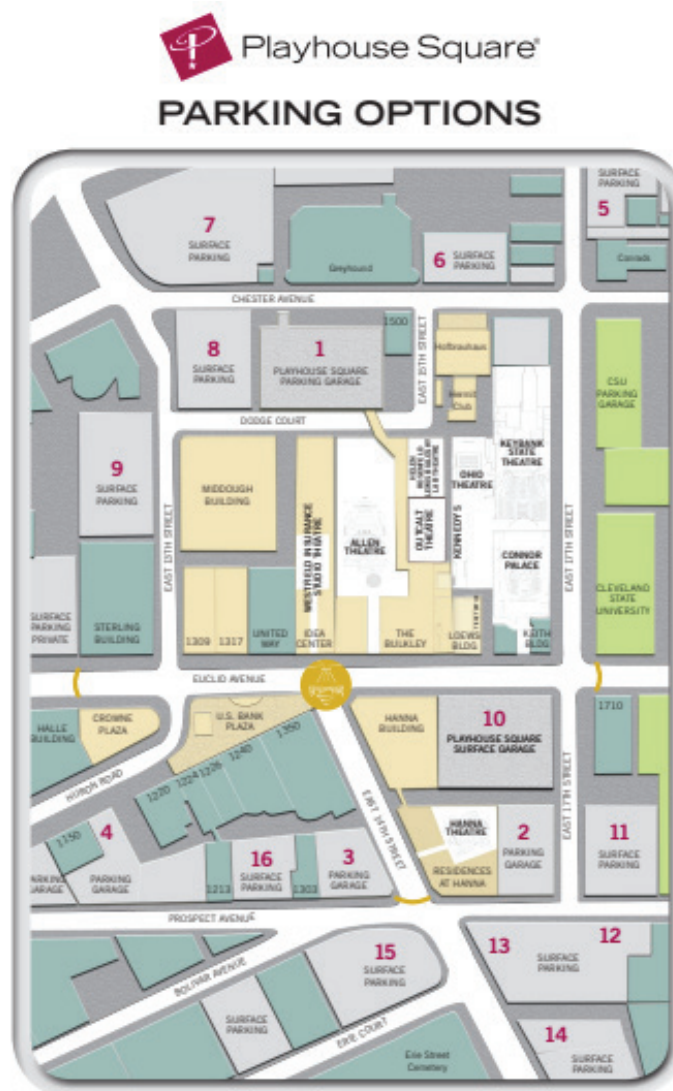
- My performance is at the Allen Theatre in Playhouse Square.
- I can be dropped off in front of the theater at 1407 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland Ohio 44114.
- Red Coat ushers will greet me at the doors and help me with wayfinding.

Parking



- Or I can park in the Playhouse Square garage. The address is 1450 Chester Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44114.
- I will see signs to direct me into the parking garage.
- I may need to wait for other cars entering the garage at the same time.
- Parking in the garage cost \$25.

- For more affordable parking options. I can park at some of the nearby parking lots.

Entering from the Playhouse Square Garage



- I will take this walkway on the 2nd floor of the parking garage.
- This will lead me to the Allen Theatre.
- Red Coat ushers will be nearby to help me with wayfinding.

Ramp to the Theatre



- I can take this ramp to enter the theatre.

Ticketing



- My tickets will be available on my phone.
- I need to log into my Cleveland Play House account to access my tickets.
- If I need help finding my tickets, friendly Ticket Service Representatives are present at the box office to support me.

Good Life Ambassadors



- If I need sensory kits before my performance, Good Life Ambassadors who are volunteers with the Cuyahoga Department of Developmental Disabilities will be in the lobby to assist me.

Restrooms



- When I need to use the restroom, I can take the ramp or stairs.
- The Allen Theatre lobby has women and men restrooms, accessible stalls, and a private gender-neutral/family stall.
- I may need to wait to use a stall.
- The hand dryers may be loud I can cover my ears or use my headphones.

Elevator



- If my seats are in the balcony, I can use the elevator outside of the theatre.
- A Red Coat usher can help me find the elevator.
- I may also use the stairs inside of the Allen Theatre.

Allen Lobby



- The Allen Theatre lobby may be lively with people excited to attend the performance.
- The lobby may be loud. I can go to one of the quiet spaces if I feel overwhelmed.

Sensory Room



- When I visit the sensory room, I can use a variety of tools to help me feel calm, comfortable, and regulated.
- Some of the tools available to me include tactile tiles, sensory bins, crash pads, cushions and a tent. I can choose the tool that works best for me.

Relaxation Room



- When I visit the relaxation room, I can use the space to help myself feel calm and comfortable.
- I can sit on soft seating options such as bean bag chairs or cushions, listen to calming music, and experience light aromatherapy scents. I can choose the options that help me feel best at that time.

Photobooth



- Before the performance, I can take pictures at the photobooth to create lasting memories.
- I may need to wait my turn if others are using the photobooth.
- The photobooth works like an iPad, I press the picture button and prepare for my photo.
- It counts down, giving me time to pose and smile.
- I can send the picture to my mobile device.

Community Activities



- I can participate in a fun arts and crafts activity focused on friendship and community.
- I will return my art supplies in the location I found them when I finish.

Photo Exhibit



- I can visit a photo exhibit that highlights friendships in Cleveland.
- This exhibit can help me think about my own friendships and how much they matter to me.

Dramaturgy Panel



- I may see people reading a dramaturgy panel. This is a display board that shares background information about the play such as the themes and creative process.

Inside the Theatre



- During the performance, the house lights will be only slightly dark.
- Cleveland Play House production staff made sure the sound is not too loud, but I can wear my noise canceling headphones.
- There will be CPH staff members that will hold up paddles when I need to prepare for dramatic moments in the play.
- I am free to enter and exit the theatre when I need to.
- I am also encouraged to respond to moments in the play that resonate with me.

Exiting the Theatre



- After the performance I will return any items I borrowed. I am welcome to keep the sensory kit provided by the Good Life ambassadors.
- I can exit the theatre through the same doors I entered.
- Red Coat ushers will help with wayfinding to my car, bus, or van.
- I can complete a survey to share my feedback about the play.
