BEHIND THE SCENES: THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

compiled by Education Department staff members

The arts possess a remarkable capacity to have a positive impact on a child's holistic development, influencing their cognitive, behavioral, social, and intellectual abilities. Our educational initiatives are dedicated to assisting schools and communities in ensuring that children and their families have access to the arts and reap its benefits. Cleveland Play House is committed to developing programs that are safe, constructive, trauma-informed, and anti-racist, while also being culturally adept and innovative.

Theatre provides an ideal platform to convey one of the most enduring and fundamental principles of education: the cultivation of responsible, productive citizens equipped with essential life skills that include effective communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity. CPH employs theatrical skills as instruments to



unite different communities, enhance our understanding of both ourselves and others, and heighten our artistic awareness as active participants and practitioners. Through our wide array of educational programs catering to children, educators, and the community, CPH contributes to the formation of responsible citizens of the modern era while creating valuable programs that can serve as models nationwide. The four pillars of the CPH Education Department are:



1. CARE Cleveland: Compassionate
Arts Remaking Education (CARE)
stands as a theatre education program
for students in grades K-12 rooted in
research-based methodologies. CPH
teaching artists employ the tenets of
trauma-informed care and culturally
responsive teaching to design and execute a curriculum that enhances children's emotional skills within a secure
and beneficial setting. Furthermore, the
curriculum deliberately integrates best
practices in literacy.

2. Out-of-School-Time Learning: Our Out-of-School-Time Learning initiatives offer students in grades K-12 the chance to participate in cost-free arts-focused programs right in their local community. Additionally, children and their families have the option to choose from daily offerings that encompass academic support, health, and well-being, culturally tailored activities, and programs that promote positive youth development. Children also receive a nutritious snack or meal during their participation in the program.





3. Community Development: Throughout the year, CPH hosts events that engage children, families, and members of the community, while a total of 1,400 children benefit from daily services at schools within the neighborhoods of Clark-Fulton, West Boulevard, South Collinwood, and Lee Harvard. By collaborating with the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) and local organizations, CPH makes substantial investments in enhancing the well-being and achievements of the community through the Wraparound and Creative Community Building initiatives. Within these programs, we leverage the arts as a conduit for community members to unite in collective efforts and formulate solutions to shared challenges, recognizing that these community members are the experts on their own lives and neighborhoods.



4. Family Theatre: At CPH, we hold the belief that "theatre provides fresh avenues for exploring real-life experiences, imaginations, emotions, and potential solutions crucial for driving transformative change" (*Brym, 2006*). Through the creation of original plays and the development of family-friendly theatrical experiences designed to gently initiate conversations between children and their guardians, we aspire to foster cross-generational

discussions within families. Our aim is to shift the responsibility for change from individual solutions to collective community efforts. Our new theatrical commissions involve the incorporation of voices from our local communities. This is achieved through a combination of face-to-face and virtual interviews and gatherings facilitated by our local team, community anchor institutions, and playwrights.
